It has been a quarter of hits and misses - the launch of Incable HITS, the resurgence of state level players, the emergence of Optimus as a stakeholder in the cable domain and governance on cable becoming a reality. Reliance Jio is just about to launch a mobile app for the cable community, through players such as MIMO Tech, and UPASS is looking at a cable service offering that suits the

LCO/MSO. These are some of the milestones that the industry should cover before the start of the New Year.

Mybox came of age with its acquisition by Hero and is poised to be a global player in the STB space riding digitization in India and the emerging markets. The big cable players continue their consolidation and expansion in the three to six million STB band. Fastway is on the way to reaching the four million mark.

An accent on skills

It is now widely acknowledged that Digital India cannot happen without Skill India and SCTE is poised to be the harbinger of this change. The first batches of skilled SCTE professionals will receive their certificates in January 2016 and already there is a keen interest from digital players to lap up these certified skilled players.

SCTE and ESSCI partnered with the Telangana Cable Association and Novacom to bring about this transformation in skills. In Andhra Pradesh alone, the target is to train and certify more than ten thousand cable and broadband professionals. These skills will set the foundation of a digital Telangana and assist in a robust implementation of the digital cable and broadband transition.
